

**YATES CENTER CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
NOVEMBER 25, 2013**

City Council met in regular session on Monday, November 25, 2013, at 7:00pm at city hall. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mayor Weber called the meeting to order. Roll call as follows: Reser, Randall, Day, Beecher, Stuber, and Bishop. Absent: Black and Jones. Other city officials present included: City Attorney Tom Mikulka, Street Superintendent Randy Hegwald, and City Clerk Becky Boice.

AGENDA APPROVED

Motion was made by Day, seconded by Bishop, to approve the agenda as printed. Motion carried unanimously.

MINUTES APPROVED

Motion was made by Day, seconded by Bishop, to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2013, meeting as printed. Motion carried unanimously.

CITY ATTORNEY

City Attorney Mikulka had nothing to report.

HEARING – 211 W SANDERSON

Discussion was held on the unsafe structure located at 211 East Sanderson. Mayor Weber opened the public hearing at 7:08pm. The parties with interest in the property failed to appear. Motion was made by Randall, seconded by Stuber to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously and the public hearing was closed at 7:09pm.

It was the consensus of the council to have Mikulka prepare a resolution to continue proceedings for the removal of the unsafe structure.

**DARRIN PETROWSKY – KDOT
ROAD SAFETY AUDIT**

Darrin Petrowsky with the Kansas Department of Transportation was present to discuss the recent Road Safety Audit. He presented council with Field Review Recommendations that need to be corrected in a timely manner. Also discussed were requirements for retroreflectivity. A complete draft report will be sent from KDOT giving the city 30 days to respond with any questions before a formal report is given. The city has a connecting link contract with the state to provide maintenance on Hwy 54 & Hwy 75 inside of the city limits.

MAYOR COMMENTS


Mayor Weber had no comments.

Motion was made by Day, seconded by Bishop, to pay the claims and vouchers in the amount of \$56,877.03. Motion carried unanimously.


ADJOURNMENT
